A. Strategies 360 Legislative Update

Stephanie Wright from Strategies 360 gave a legislative update. She discussed new representatives, budget issues, and reviewed the status of Marysville's projects. The wins for Marysville were the \$5 million move from the Grove Street project over to the 156th Street overpass and the half million dollars that was awarded to the Bayview Trail project. The roundabout at 92nd and Highway 9 and the 88th Street project did not get funding this year because no new projects were approved this year. She commended the Mayor and Council for their clear and consistent advocacy which has helped them be successful. She discussed what will be happening in the off-season. The Mayor and Council thanked her for the work she does on behalf of Marysville.

Public Comment

Maria, 98270, and her boyfriend, Costa, spoke as first time homeowners in Marysville. They expressed concern about the home directly to the left of them which is completely neglected by the owner resulting in overgrown weeds, decay and vermin. They also expressed concern that squatters might take advantage of the situation. This has been an ongoing issue for years. Mayor Nehring thanked her for the comments and indicated code enforcement is getting involved in the situation. There was some discussion about the situation and what the homeowners and neighbors can do.

Mark Henderson, 98271, reported on a previous home invasion, suspected poisoning, and related health concerns. Mayor Nehring encouraged him to report this to the police. Mr. Henderson reviewed interactions he has had with the police and dissatisfaction with

those interactions. He is concerned about his safety and would like help with an investigation.

David Russell, 98270, urged the City to continue the tradition of supporting multicultural, diversity, and tolerance that makes Marysville what it is.
