He explained that none of the improvements done with Phase 1 will be impacted by future intersection improvements.

Councilmember Richards asked staff to look into speed limits as referred to by Ms. Kinnamon. Director Laycock explained that the topic of speed limits would be coming back in the future.

Councilmember Norton spoke to the value of continuous flow movements and agreed that more education could be helpful for the Council.
