- He also attended the Public Works committee. They discussed the 2026 CIP updates, 108<sup>th</sup> Street sidewalk that the two MP students brought forward, and roadside memorials

- Public Safety Committee met on March 17<sup>th</sup>. They discussed the State Bills that passed and potential impacts to the city specifically law enforcement. They reviewed crime statistics which had a large drop compared to last year. At the time of the meeting, there were 7 patrol and 3 custody openings. New Records staff are currently training but close to being fully staffed. Jail fencing project is

almost complete. Everett recently passed a law protecting children from fentanyl exposure. They will continue discussing at the committee level but may come to Council later to address the gap in State law.
